Pre-Nursing Academy students who maintain a 3.3 GPA through the Pre-Nursing program will enter MWCC's Nursing Associate's Degree program during the fall of their second year.

Requirements

- Application to the Pre-Nursing Academy. Admission criteria includes GPA, SAT I scores, and 2 recommendation letters by the student's guidance counselor, science or math teacher, employer or other teacher (see the Pre-nursing Academy application for more information).
- The College Placement Test (CPT) must be completed by the student.
- Students must test into ENG 101 & MAT 121/124/126 or a higher level math prior to being accepted into the Pre-Nursing Academy.
- Pre-nursing Academy students must maintain a GPA of 3.3 or better in their coursework to be accepted to the MWCC Nursing Associate's Degree program during their second year

Pre-Nursing Academy

The application process:

This information packet explains the admissions process, as well as the entrance requirements for the Pre-Nursing Academy program at Mount Wachusett Community College. Please read this information carefully. Students may be eligible to enter the A.S. Nursing degree program upon completion of the academy. Mount Wachusett Community College seeks to enroll students who will succeed academically, thrive socially and contribute meaningfully to the campus community.

Admission to this program is competitive and seats are limited. Therefore, everyone who applies may not be admitted to the program.

Your high school academic record is the single most important factor in our evaluation process for academy admission. The quality and level of courses, grade point average, and grade trends are all important factors. SAT I and/or ACT scores, counselor and teacher recommendations are required as is a personal essay. Your work and/or volunteer experience and extracurricular activities may strengthen your overall credentials for admission. SAT II test scores are not required but may add support to your application. The TOEFL is recommended for students who are not native speakers of English.

The grades you earn in college preparatory courses are re-calculated into a grade point average (GPA). In re-calculating your GPA, you will receive extra credit for honors or Advanced Placement courses. Non-college preparatory courses are not included; therefore, the GPA calculated by the College will be different than the GPA calculated by your high school.

Your grades will be converted to a 4.0 scale, where "A" = 4.0, "B" = 3.0, "C" = 2.0, and "D" = 1.0. On this scale, a 3.0 GPA is equal to a "B" average. A 3.0 minimum GPA is preferred.

Candidates for admission who have completed the high school diploma requirement by earning the General Equivalency Diploma (GED) must submit official GED score reports with a preferred minimum attainment in the 75th percentile in all subject areas; an official copy of the high school transcript showing work completed and/or attempted with grades earned; and a personal statement of no fewer than 150 words outlining academic and career goals as well as life experience and/or a professional resume.

How to apply:

Students can obtain academy applications from their guidance counselors. Applications may also be obtained from the admissions office, Mount Wachusett Community College, 444 Green Street, Gardner, MA 01440, (978)630-9284.

Each applicant must submit the following materials:

- An official copy of the high school or GED transcript; Note: Students must be 2008 or 2009 high school or GED graduates only.
- A completed college application accompanied by the \$10.00 application fee.
- An official copy of SAT I, ACT, or TOEFL (for non-native speakers of English). Note: Test results should be submitted directly to the College from the testing agency.
- Two recommendations: one from a Guidance Counselor and one from a math or science teacher, or employer, or other teacher.
- Essay or personal statement about interest and intention in the Nursing profession.

NOTE: Beginning in spring 2005, the SAT I will include a student-written essay and multiple choice writing section. Mount Wachusett Community College will require official scores of all SAT I results only. SAT II results may be submitted to support your application.

High school students should request an official high school transcript that includes at least the first marking period of the senior year. Also, a final high school transcript must be requested at the time of graduation that indicates successful completion of the requirements to graduate from high school. All transcript materials requested by the applicant become the property of Mount Wachusett Community College and cannot be released to the applicant or to other institutions or agencies.

Students must take the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) prior to being accepted into the Associate Degree Nursing Program. The TEAS is a computer based assessment that tests students on their Reading, Mathematics, Science, English, and Language Usage Skills.

INFORMATION SESSIONS:

The nursing department offers monthly information sessions that will include program information, the admissions process, and financial aid information. Attendance at one information session is strongly suggested. Transcript reviews are not conducted at these sessions. Please call (978) 630-9284

Priority Application Deadlines for fall 2009:

Enrollment in the Pre-Nursing Academy is restricted to fall semester only. Students should submit the required application materials to the admissions office by March 15. However, Mount Wachusett Community College will accept academy applications through June 1 on a space available basis.
